Prepositions are words placed in front of nouns. They create phrases which provide more detail about the action happening in a sentence. They can tell you:

- location e.g. in, on
- movement e.g. to, from, into, out of
- a state or circumstance e.g. with, without

The slaves sail to the island.

PREPOSITIONS

WITH THE ACCUSATIVE

puella per villam ambulat.

The girl walks through the house.
